

**COUNCIL MINUTES**  
**CITY OF PARKER REGULAR MEETING**  
**Wednesday, October 12, 2022 7:00 p.m.**

The Parker City Council met in regular session on Wednesday, October 12, 2022 in the council room of City Hall. Members present: Council members: Harms, RBuller, JBuller, Poncelet, Kuchta, Janzen and Mayor Nolan. Other persons attending: Finance Officer Jans, Darrell Buller, Donovan DeBoer, Donna Rumbaugh, Angie Poppe, Tanya Wickstrom, Erin Patten, Audrea Buller, Ransom Jones, and Lavonne Meyer. Mayor Nolan declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

All action in following minutes carried by unanimous vote unless otherwise stated.

- 22.117 Motion by RBuller, seconded by Poncelet to approve the September 12, 2022 regular meeting and September 28, 2022 special meeting minutes. Motion carried.
- 22.118 Motion by Harms, seconded by Janzen to approve the October claims as presented except Parker Pharmacy. List attached. Motion carried. September salaries: General Fund: \$28,600.64. Enterprise Fund: \$14,406.68. Total salaries: \$43,007.32.
- 22.119 Motion by Kuchta, seconded by RBuller to approve claim to Parker Pharmacy. Poncelet abstained. Motion carried.

Parker School Superintendent Donovan DeBoer and school board member Ransom Jones were present to discuss the upcoming bond election and answer any questions.

Discussion at length regarding a dog attack.

- 22.121 Motion by Poncelet, seconded by Harms to approve the 2023 Law Enforcement Contract with Turner County. Motion carried.
- 22.122 Motion by Poncelet, seconded by JBuller to allow the 100 block of N Cherry Avenue residents to delay sidewalk installation until after the road and curb/gutter in front of their property is completed with Phase 6 Utility Improvements. Motion carried.
- 22.123 Motion by Poncelet, seconded by Kuchta to approve the final replat of Lot 1 of Buller Addition. JBuller abstained. Motion carried.

Discussion regarding Purcell Park. General consensus was to move forward deeding the property to Turner Village.

- 22.124 Motion by Harms, seconded by Janzen to approve the 2021 audit. Motion carried.

Department Reports: Finance Officer Jans advised that the school is looking at moving forward to move the Little Pheasant's daycare to Kimball Ave. Jans explained steps that need to be taken. Jans also discussed city hall hours with the council. After discussion Mayor Nolan requested it be placed on the November agenda.
